4 INFORMATION ON THE CONTENTS AND RESULTS GAINED

4.1 Mode of study:

Full-time

4.2 Programme requirements:

According to the National Law for Higher education and the Department's Internal Regulation, students graduate after having

successfully attended all courses, 32 compulsory and 16 elective, of the program successfully completed and defended the optional Final Dissertation and accumulated 240 ECTS credits.

Upon completion of their studies the graduates gain the opportunity –through the teaching and research of language, linguistics, literature and culture of the people of the Black Sea countries, including citizens of Greek origin– to delve into their areas of specialization. Indepth investigation of a specific field denotes the procurement of language and communication in the student's language of choice, as well as the study of the historical, social and cultural context, where applicable. Through their studies –knowledge of language of choice and pyramidoid arrangement of courses (introduction to the Black Sea culture, history, society, economy, folk art)– the graduates obtain solid knowledge –as possible– on each country and culture.

Furthermore, the graduates upon completion of their studies are capable to:

research in depth the wider developments of country(-ies) or people

manipulate in all types of oral and written language, in order to explore specific fields of their area of expertise: the cultural context in which language is part of.

study, research, understand and promote the languages, literature and culture of the Black Sea countries, such as Greeks, Bulgarians, Romanians, Russians, Turks, Ukrainians, Georgians, Armenians etc.

- c) And, potentially, in: the public and private sector, e.g. Ministries; Local Administration Level A and B; state and private cultural agencies; organizations and foundations with educational, cultural and research activities; the Media (print and digital form); publication houses focusing on the language, literature and culture of the Black Sea countries; as members, consultants, educators or consultants of diplomatic missions to Black Sea countries; as experts in research foundations; as translators of texts and interpreters.

8. INFORMATION ON THE NATIONAL HIGHER EDUCATION SYSTEM

(i)Structure

According to the Framework Law (2007), higher education consists of two parallel sectors: the University sector (Universities, Polytechnics, Fine art Schools, the Open University) and the Technological sector (Technological Education Institutions(TEI) and the School of Pedagogic and Technological Education). The same Law regulates issues concerning governance of higher education along the general lines of increased participation, greater transparency, accountability and increased autonomy.

There are also State Non University Tertiary Institutions offering vocationally oriented courses of shorter duration (2 to 3 years) which operate under the authority of other Ministries.

(ii)Access

Entrance to the various Schools of the Universities (*Panepistimio*) and Technological Education Institutions (*Technoligo Ekpaideftiko Idryma - TEI*) depends on the general score obtained by Lyceum graduates on the Certificate, as described above (Section 5.iv), on the number of available places (*numerous clausus*) and on the candidates' ranked preferences among schools and sections.

(iii) Qualifications

Students who successfully complete their studies in Universities an TEI are awarded a *Ptychio* (fist cycle degree). First cycle programmes last from four years for most fields to five years for engineering and certain other applied science fields and six years for medicine. The *Ptychio* leads to employment of further study at the postgraduate level that includes the one year second cycle leading to the second degree, *Metaptychiako Dimpoma Eidikefsis* – equivalent to the *Master's* degree – and the third cycle leading to the doctorate degree, *Didactoriko Diploma*.

Recent legislation on quality assurance in Higher Education, the Credit Transfer System and the Diploma Supplement defines the framework and criteria for evaluation of university departments and for certification of student degrees. These measures aim at promoting student mobility and contributing to the creation of a European Higher Education Area.
