FOUNDATION & STRUCTURE

The Department of Languages, Literature and Culture of the Black Sea Countries is an interdisciplinary Department which accepted its first students in September 2000.

It was established by the Presidential Decree 90, Government Gazette 74/10-3-2000, within the framework of the Programme of the Ministry of National Education and Religious Affairs for the Expansion of Higher Education and was funded by the European Union through the Operational Programme for Education and Initial Vocational Training (EPEAEK).

According to its Founding Decree, its main mission is "the cultivation, promotion and dissemination, through teaching and research, of the language, linguistics, literature and culture of the peoples of the Black Sea countries, especially those of Greek origin, and the training of scientists capable of studying, researching, understanding and disseminating the languages, literature and culture of the peoples of the aforementioned countries, such as Greeks, Russians, Turks and others".

It is located in the centre of the city of Komotini, in the old building complex of the Department of Law. It has an excellent technological infrastructure (multimedia rooms, computer room, language learning room, etc.). Through continuous collective efforts of lecturers, administrative staff and students, the interior of the building is constantly being upgraded in order to provide a welcoming environment.

Currently 13 members serve as academic staff (D.E.P.), 4 members as special teaching staff (E.E.P.), 3 members as special teaching research staff (E.E.DI.P.) and 1 member as special technical laboratory staff (E.T.E.P.).

In the academic year 2015-16, the International, Inter-university, Inter-departmental Postgraduate Programme "Psychopedagogical, didactic and intercultural approaches in the Humanistic Sciences" was established, which is a collaboration between our Department and the Department of Education Sciences of the University Suor Orsola Benincasa of Naples (Government Gazette 915, 5-4-2015 t. B' GG 1204/23-6-2015). This Postagraduate Programme has enrolled 190 postgraduate students during its first 3 years of operation. Based on the Law No. 4485, Government Gazette 114/A/4-8-2017, it was re-established in 2018 (YA 80/57, Government Gazette 2930, 20-7-2018, vol. 53 postgraduate students have been selected and enrolled in the 2021-2022 cycle of studies.

In 2018, a second Postgraduate Programme was established in the Department. The programme was

entitled: "Black Sea region and Hellenism" (YA 86/58, Government Gazette 2870/19-7- 2018). This is a tuition-free MA Programme which is operational from the academic year 2020- 2021 and is attended by 16 postgraduate students.

In 2020, a third Postgraduate Programme of the Department was established. The Programme was entitled: "Comparative Literature in the Black Sea Region" (YA 41/33, Government Gazette -B-4512.14.10.2020), and operates from the academic year 2020-2021 with 9 students.

For the period 2006-2013, the Postgraduate Studies Programme entitled "Studies in the Black Sea Region" operated in the Department. 137 students graduated from this Programme.

The professional opportunities of the graduates of the Department of Languages, Literature and Culture of the Black Sea Countries are listed:

A. in the founding Decree 90, Government Gazette 74/10-3-2000:

"......Graduates can be employed as executives in Greek state services, consular offices, or private enterprises in the Black Sea countries (Russia, Ukraine, Georgia, Armenia, Romania, Bulgaria, Turkey) or as instructors of the relevant language or as freelancers or as experts or as consultants to diplomatic missions in the aforementioned countries or as specialists in research institutions or as text translators".

"Graduates of the Department of Languages, Literature and Culture of the Black Sea Countries of the Democritus University of Thrace are professionally active in the following fields: a) in the cultivation, promotion and dissemination of the Black Sea languages (Russian, Romanian, Turkish, Bulgarian, etc. (b) in education - both public and private - as teachers of the languages of the Black Sea countries and as members of the educational system; c) in public and private sector institutions such as ministries; d) in the teaching and research of the languages of the Black Sea countries, including the cultivation, development and dissemination of the literary education and culture of the peoples of the Black Sea countries; e) in public and private sector institutions such as ministries; f) in education - both public and private - as teachers of the languages of the Black Sea countries and as members of the educational system; g) in public and private sector institutions such as ministries, local authorities, public and private cultural bodies, organisations and institutions with educational, cultural and research activities, communication and information media (printed and electronic press), publishing organisations whose subject matter is related to the language, literature and culture of the Black Sea countries, as staff, consultants, trainers or as advisers to diplomatic missions in the Black Sea countries, as experts in research institutions, as translators of texts and as interpreters, making a scientific and creative contribution to the cultivation and dissemination of the literary education and culture of the peoples of the Black Sea countries.

Approval of the Foreign Language Teaching Programme for the granting of foreign language teaching qualifications in foreign language centres, which equals to 30 ECTS, (Democritus University of Thrace (D.U.Th.).

Renewal of the Foreign Language Teaching Programme for the granting of competence for foreign language teaching in foreign language centres at the Democritus University of Thrace (D.U.TH.). The 2nd and 3rd course cycles have been completed.

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The Department of Language, Literature and Culture of the Black Sea Countries participates in the Erasmus+ exchange programme for the reception and sending of students from all study cycles (undergraduate, postgraduate, doctoral candidates) to and from other countries. For this purpose, the Department maintains partnerships with corresponding departments of the European Union and participates in the ECTS course recognition system. At the same time, the Department takes part in International Mobility programmes with countries such as Ukraine, Russia etc., giving students the opportunity to spend part of their studies in partner institutions, receiving a scholarship. Students also have the opportunity to carry out an internship abroad for a certain period of time.

1.ERASMUS- STUDIES

With regard to the Erasmus+ Internship, students should seek out the host organisation themselves and ensure that they are accepted for the period they are interested in, as there are no bilateral agreements specifying travel destinations. Student care

Undergraduate and postgraduate students are entitled, under certain conditions set by law, to free food and accommodation. This is provided by the University in the student clubs and halls of residence operating in each city, according to income criteria announced annually by the Administration of the University of Thessaloniki.

Undergraduate students (except for those who are enrolled after success in Katataktiries examinations) are issued with discount ticket student cards (PASO) for urban and intercity

transport use. They are also entitled to an e-mail address, provided by the Computing Centre of the University of Thessaloniki.

Textbooks: Students choose one of the books suggested by the lecturer, which is provided free of charge. The textbooks are approved by the General Assembly of the Department, on the proposal of the lecturer. Applications for textbooks are made by students via the Eudoxos system: http://eudoxus.gr

Food: A Student Club is located in the university campus to provide meals for students. Free meals are provided to students who meet the conditions set by a Senate decision.

Accommodation: undergraduate and postgraduate students are entitled, under certain conditions set by law, to free accommodation provided by the University in the student clubs and halls of residence that operate in each city, according to income criteria announced annually by the administration of the University of Thessaloniki.

Health care: Students are entitled to full medical and hospital care. To this end, a health booklet, which is renewed annually, is issued by the Department's secretariat upon registration. Undergraduate and postgraduate students of higher education institutions, whether national, homogenous or foreign, are entitled to health care for a period equal to the minimum duration of the years of study provided for in the undergraduate and postgraduate courses of the Department, increased by half. In the case of the final year of study, the treatment shall be extended beyond the end of the academic year until 31 December for those who have not received their degree by that date.

Student Psychosocial Support Service: The Student Psychosocial Support Service (PSYF) of the Democritus University of Thrace started operating in April 2016. It supports students to get to know themselves better and to cope with possible difficulties in their lives. There are no specific criteria for using the service. Difficulties experienced by each student are considered worthy of consideration and support. All students of the University of Thessaloniki have the right to use this service and the services provided are free of charge. The Service PSYF is housed in the Administration building (Rectory) of the University of Thessaloniki, located on the campus of Komotini. More information can be found at: psyf.duth.gr

Facilitated travel: Students are entitled to a discount on the ticket price for their travel within the country, which is as follows:

- 50% on public transport in the city where the department in which they are studying is located

- 25% in the case of long-distance road transport services.

In addition, from 13/5/2013 there is a 50% reduction in the fare for students who are entitled to a special ticket, on long-distance road transport services connecting the seat of their school of study with their place of permanent residence (Ministry of Education and

Religious Affairs, Protocol No: F.5 /66409/B3). The university also hires buses in the cities in which it is located to transport students free of charge to and from the places of education, food and accommodation. When travelling, students are obliged to show their special ticket (pass), which they secure themselves by submitting their application online to the Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs (http://paso.minedu.gov.gr).

Prizes - scholarships: For undergraduate students, the state aid scheme is in force, which includes scholarships from I.K.Y. Scholarships are awarded on the sole basis of academic performance and the student's financial situation. Further information is available from the Departmental Secretariat. Electronic services Students at DUTh have access to various electronic services by acquiring a user account. There are services which are available to all students of the Greek Higher Education and services which are only available to students of the DUTh.

The Programme of Studies of the Department includes:

a) Compulsory courses (C). b) Compulsory elective courses (CE). Each student of the the Department will choose fifteen (15) (Bulgarian, Romanian, Russian direction) or sixteen (16) (Turkish direction) compulsory elective courses in the whole course of his/her studies, which offer an in-depth study of specific issues dealt with in the compulsory courses and foster the spirit of research, practical training and contact with the language and culture of the direction of study. They are taught in three-hour, weekly sessions and correspond to four (4) credit hours (ECTS) each.

c) Free elective courses (FE): The Department offers students free elective courses, in addition to the compulsory (C) and compulsory elective (CE) courses, which aim to cultivate skills and familiarize students with subjects relevant to their studies, regardless of their field of study. Although they do not correspond to credit points (ECTS), the selection and examination of free-choice courses are indicated in the student's Analytical Grade Record. In this context, courses in computer science and learning the Pontic dialect are offered.
